
How you can help

Wraparound Services

Highly individualized mental health interventions designed to support a child in his home, school and



Child intensive Case

Management

For children and adolescents from birth to 18 whose functioning is severely impaired and who have multi-system

Family Based Services

Community-based therapy and support services to children and adolescents with emotional and behavioral problems. Provides

ing communication skills and family conflict management.

Clinical Options toward **REcovery (CORE)**

Outpatient and Intensive Outpatient Treatment for adolescents, adults and families who are affected by drug and alcohol problems.



Preschool Intervention Program (PIP)

A therapeutic, center-based program designed to meet the chiatrist, psychologist, therapist, and other trained professionals.

Family Life Education & Counseling Services (FLECS)

A therapeutic program designed to address the social, emotional, educational and behavioral problems of children ages 5 to 12 years.

Adult Services

Approximately one in five American adults have their lives interrupted by some form of mental illness. Central provides the necessary support to enable people living with mental illness to be productive members of society. A partial list of services appears here.

Outpatient Services

Clinical support providing communication and coping skills on an individual, couple and family basis.

Case Management

A range of services including community support, resource referral, assistance in accessing care and intensive supports.

Intensive Outpatient Program

A comprehensive therapeutic experience, including behavioral and cognitive skills training, symptom and medication understanding and management techniques, family psycho-education and peer mentoring.

Acute Partial Hospital Program

An all-day, short-term program that helps in the transition of adults recently discharged from psychiatric hospitals, or who may be at risk for hospitalization.

Clinical Options toward REcovery (CORE)

Structured support for people with addiction problems.

Senior Outreach Services (SOS)

For homebound persons ages 60 and older providing in-home evaluations, medication management and caretaker training.



Certified Peer Specialist Services

Provide support, advocacy and peer counseling services by sharing personal experiences of hope and recovery.

Community Outreach

Provide interaction, support and education for local businesses and community services.

That's an unexpected statement from a woman of forty-six. But then again, Karen's life has had many unexpected moments.

Karen's struggles began with the accidental death of her teenage son. Unable to deal with the grief, she began a descent into severe depression. Not only was her own life at risk, the lives of her two remaining sons were impacted as well.

"I didn't want to kill myself," Karen admits. "I just didn't care if I lived or died."

Treatment at a psychiatric hospital could only do so much. Karen entered the Acute program at Central to continue her care.

"The people at Central did more than change my life—they saved

Through group and individual therapy, Karen learned that life doesn't have to end with the death of a child.

"Therapy at Central helped me express myself with my voice. Then the creativity came."

Karen has embarked on a new life, one filled with art and promise. She still returns to Central calling it her "relief valve" for whenever pressure builds.
