Are you experiencing a cough or shortness of breath? Have you recently traveled outside the country? Have you been in direct contact with an individual confirmed case of COVID-19? If yes to any of the questions then face to face contact is prohibited and the individual is referred to contact their Primary Care Physician for further screening.

• Our cleaning company and maintenance department have increased sanitization efforts in all areas of our facilities on a daily basis.

We will continue to monitor and adapt service delivery as directed by the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the World Health Organization (WHO), state and county officials and Magellan Behavioral Health.
